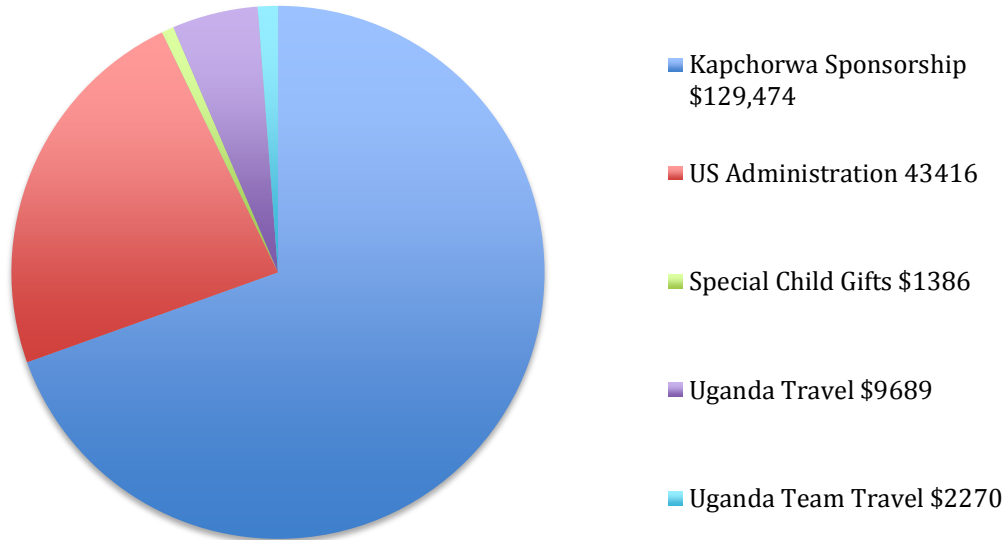
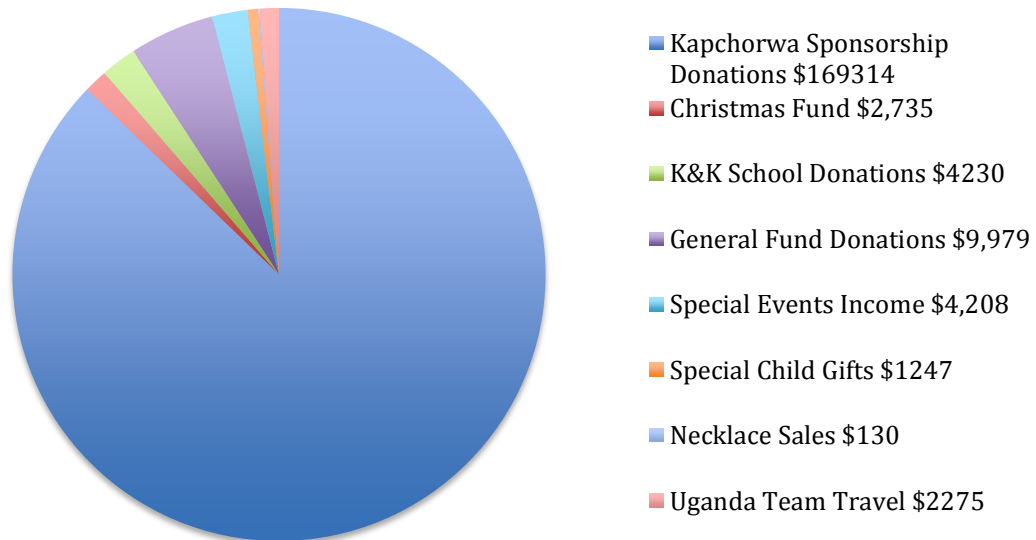


## 2014 Report of Funds Received and Expenses

### 2014 Project Income



In March 2014, Hope Africa International (HAI) was established as an independent 501c3 non-profit. This means that HAI was completely, financially separate from the former ministry of Vast Church in Sisters, Oregon by June 2014. The financials reported here are a combination of both funds received by *Hope Africa dba Vast Church* and *Hope Africa International*. We felt it was important to combine the financials as the program has continued to benefit the same children in spite of the legal changes of the program. *If*

Of the sponsorship funds received, 76% was sent to Uganda for child school fees, uniforms, project expenses, medical care and project center days (retreats) for the children. USA administration accounts for 20% of sponsorship donations. USA administration is also supported by 14% of K&K Primary School sponsorships and the General Fund. 4% of sponsorship donations were saved for the African Reserve Fund for Kapchorwa leaving us with a total balance of \$20,805.

In October 2014, Hope Africa International began an official partnership with Powell Butte Christian Church and Kingdomworks Ministries International to sponsor K&K Primary School in Uganda. The funds received at the end of 2014 were not spent, but saved for the beginning of 2015. K&K Primary School also had a reserve fund with a balance of \$430 at the end of 2014.

Nissen & Meyer CPAs annually review Hope Africa International's bookkeeping in order to submit the non-profit IRS tax return.
